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Importance of Special Education

Special education plays a vital role in the educational system by addressing the unique learning needs of children with disabilities and learning difficulties. Example: A child with intellectual disability is trained in basic numeracy and self-care skills according to ability level.

Example: A child with hearing impairment studies in a normal classroom using a hearing aid and sign-supported teaching.

It helps to build self-confidence, independence, and social interaction skills among the person with disability. So, special education is important specially for them.

Example: A child with autism is taught turn-taking and eye contact through social-skills training.

6. Teaches Life Skills

Special education focuses on daily living and vocational skills for independent living of children with special needs. It helps to develop life skills among them which solve their day-to-day activities.

Example: A student with multiple disabilities is trained in personal hygiene, simple job skills like packing items, washing hands before and after food.

7. Early Identification and Intervention

Early support reduces learning difficulties among the person with disability. Through special education, early identification of different disabilities can be done and intervention can also be provided at the earliest.

Example: Early speech therapy for a child with speech delay helps improve communication before school age.

8. Use of Special Teaching Aids

Special education allows the teacher to use different types of special techniques, tools, aids, methods and therapies for treating the such children.

Example: Use of hearing aids for children having hearing impairment or ramps and wheelchairs for children with physical disabilities.

9. Involvement of Parents and Community

Parents are guided to support learning at home, creating a supportive environment with the help of special education.

Example: Parents are trained to practice communication exercises with their child at home.

10. Protects Rights and Dignity of Children with Disabilities

Special education ensures education as a fundamental and legal right for the children having multiple disabilities.

Example: Under the RPwD Act, 2016, children with disabilities receive free and appropriate education in nearby schools.
